## THE RAW MATERIAL

Someone has suggested that if Jesus were to send his twelve disciples for psychological testing today he might receive this reply: "Thank you for submitting the résumés of the twelve men you have picked for managerial positions in your new organization. All of them have taken our complete battery of tests. In addition, we arranged personality interviews for each of your candidates with our psychologists and vocational aptitude consultants. It is the opinion of our staff that most of your nominees are lacking in the background, education, and skills necessary for the success of your enterprise. None of them shows an understanding of the team concept. Simon Peter is impulsive and would benefit from anger-management counseling. Andrew has no measureable leadership qualities. The two brothers, James and John, place personal ambition above company loyalty. Thomas shows a skeptical attitude that would tend to undermine morale. In his previous business, Matthew was blacklisted by the Jerusalem Better Business Bureau. James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus definitely have radical political leanings, and appear to have unstable temperaments. One of the candidates, however, shows real potential. He is a man of ability and resourcefulness, possesses excellent social skills, and has contacts in high places. He is highly motivated, ambitious, and responsible. We recommend Judas Iscariot as your comptroller and right-hand man." Today Jesus calls *us*. Like Peter, we lack faith. Like Andrew, we have much to learn. Like James and John, we are selfish. Like Matthew, we have a past. Like Thomas, we sometimes doubt. If Jesus could use them, he can certainly use us. With God's help, we too can grow from strength to strength and accomplish great things for God and the Kingdom. The call to follow Jesus is urgent. Answer now.

**January 29, 2012      4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time (Cycle B)**

**Gospel reading      A reading from the holy Gospel according  
to Mark 1:21-28 [To be read aloud]**

Then they came to Capernaum, and on the Sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes. In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, “What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!” Jesus rebuked him and said, “Quiet! Come out of him!” The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, “What is this? A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him.” His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee.

**Brief commentary:**

For Mark and the Christians of the first century the “unclean spirit” and other “demons” represented evil, mysterious powers hostile to God. In today’s text, the unclean spirit reveals Jesus’ identity and tries to derail him from his mission. Jesus’ words are not only authoritative, but they effect what they say. Everyone was amazed by his teaching and power. Mark is not concerned with stories about Jesus’ birth, but about establishing his identity as the Son of God. Already in chapter 1 Jesus’ powerful actions had drawn followers and enemies and caused his reputation to spread throughout Galilee.

**Today’s reading offers three significant messages:**

- Mark wants from his readers more than amazement. He wants to make sure they understand that the Son of Man will suffer much.
- Jesus is without a doubt a powerful teacher and a healer.
- Those who wish to follow the “amazing teacher and healer” must also take up their cross and follow him.

**For our shared or personal reflection:**

*After a brief pause for silent reflection share your answers, ideas or feelings.*

1. Am I a “good times” Christian only or am I also willing to follow Jesus in bad times? Explain.
2. Do I live in fear of the power of evil or do I trust that I follow the One who conquers all evil? Give examples.

*Suggested readings:* Catechism of the Catholic Church paragraphs 438; 1673.

4o Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario (Ciclo B)

**Lectura del Evangelio según san Marcos 1:21-28** [*Léase en voz alta*]

En Cafarnaúm, Jesús empezó a comunicar su doctrina en las asambleas del día sábado, en las sinagogas. Su manera de enseñar impresionaba mucho porque hablaba como quien tiene autoridad: era todo lo contrario de los maestros de la Ley. En una ocasión se encontraba en esta sinagoga un hombre que tenía un demonio dentro, y se puso a gritar: “¿Qué quieres de nosotros, Jesús de Nazaret? Has venido a derrocarlos? Yo te he reconocido: Tú eres el Santo de Dios”. Jesús le hizo frente con autoridad: “¡Cállate y sal de este hombre!” El espíritu malo hizo revolcarse al hombre en el suelo y lanzó un grito tremendo, pero luego salió. Entonces el asombro de todos fue tan grande que se preguntaban unos a otros: “¿Qué es esto? ¿Con qué seguridad enseña esta nueva doctrina! Incluso le obedecen los espíritus malos”. Y muy pronto, la fama de Jesús se extendió por todo el territorio de Galilea.

**Comentario breve:**

Para Marcos y los cristianos del siglo I, los “demonios” representaban el mal y todos los poderes que fueran enemigos de Dios. En los ambientes populares, las gentes vivían en un constante temor a los “espíritus impuros”, a los que se atribuían gran parte de las enfermedades mentales, congénitas y todo tipo de vicios. En el texto que leemos hoy, el demonio revela la identidad de Jesús y trata de desviarlo de su misión: “¿Qué quieres de nosotros?” Las palabras de Jesús son dichas con autoridad y además logran lo que dicen: “El espíritu malo... salió”. Todos quedaron asombrados ante su poder, y su fama se extendió por toda Galilea.

*La lectura de hoy nos presenta tres ideas importantes:*

- Marcos exige de los lectores más que asombro y admiración. El evangelista quiere que todos entiendan que el Hijo de Dios sufriría mucho en Jerusalén.
- Marcos no le presta atención a las historias del nacimiento y de la infancia de Jesús. Su propósito principal es establecer desde el principio de su Evangelio la identidad de Jesús como Hijo de Dios.
- Los que deseen seguir a este “asombroso” rabino, deben estar dispuestos a tomar su cruz y seguirlo.

**Para la reflexión personal o comunitaria:**

*Después de una pausa breve para reflexionar en silencio, comparte con otros sus ideas o sentimientos.*

¿Soy cristiano solamente cuando todo me va bien, o estoy dispuesto a seguir a Jesús también en los momentos duros y difíciles?

¿Vivo en temor a los “poderes del mal”, o confío plenamente en Aquel que ha conquistado todo mal? De ejemplos concretos.

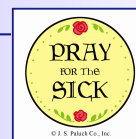
